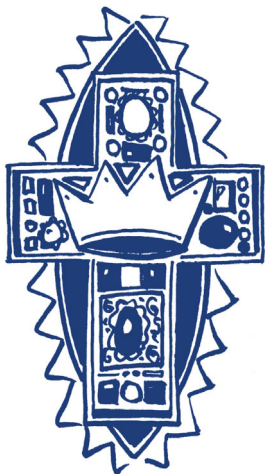

A Chess Dynasty

How would you like to be involved in an activity that puts you in the same league as Pope John Paul II & Humphrey Bogart . . . lets you win awards and be part of a winning team...and even helps fight Alzheimer's?

Students get all this and more by joining our **Parish School's Chess Club**. They meet in the cafeteria before school twice a week until January, when an additional session is added as two big tournaments approach. The students work on chess puzzles, listen to lectures, and practice against each other.

One particular Wednesday found students finding an opponent and competing. Second Grader **Liberty Leano** was playing against her father. She started last year because "I wanted to see how Chess Club is." She liked what she saw and particularly enjoys winning. "I think it's great way for her brain to develop," said **Liberty's mother, Angelique**. "This helps her with math and socializing with older kids."



Four-year veteran **Rohith Moolakatt** learned how to play, as well as how to handle winning ("don't brag about it") and losing ("you can learn from others").

Just last weekend, St. Viator pulled off a "three-peat," **winning the Catholic Schools Chess Tournament for the third year in a row**, and

they will be **defending their State Chess title in March**.



The dynamic duo behind this successful program is **Daniel Morgan and Virgil Reyes**. Daniel had always enjoyed playing

chess with his son, Greg. When Greg started at St. Viator, Daniel was recruited to create a school chess program. It was one thing teaching his son, but how would he teach a large group of children?

The answer was Virgil, who ran a chess club for adults. Daniel went to him for suggestions, then asked what it would take to get Virgil to help out in person. "Would you buy coffee in the morning?" Virgil asked. Daniel agreed and the rest is history.

Virgil used to play chess for the Navy (you thought Army/Navy *football* games were competitive?!) and is ranked as an "Expert" by the US Chess Federation (other Experts include Humphrey Bogart and John Paul II). "The reason we're so successful is because of Virgil," Daniel modestly points out. "He is probably the best teacher in the western United States."

As the students learn and compete in the cafeteria, the championship banners above them are reminders of how successful the program is -- but that's not the ultimate goal. "We use competition and awards to get them to participate, but we bring them here to get them to think," Daniel explained. "We're teaching them to learn how to use their brain so they can become better students."

The results prove they're successful.

- ◆ Our Lady of Guadalupe in Fish Lake
- ◆ Sacred Heart Parish in Ely which also serves the spiritual needs of St. Michael's in McGill

Trap - You're called on to pray and are asleep.

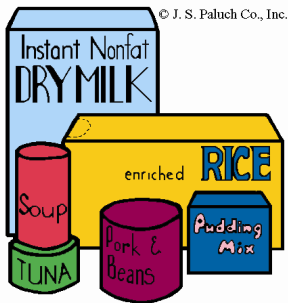
End Run - Getting out of church quick, without speaking to any guest or fellow member.

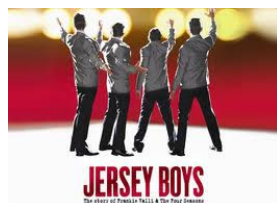
