

St. Viator Parish School Registration for 2024 - 2025

Whether you are selecting a "school home" for the next ten years and preparing your child for Pre-Kindergarten, or searching out a new warm, safe learning environment for your children, come and experience St. Viator School. Schedule a tour by calling the school office at 702.732.4477 or svsschool@stviator.org.



We began accepting registrations for the 2024-2025 school year for our Pre-Kindergarten Program. This program is designed to build academic, social and physical skills as well as bringing unity and continuity to each curricular area. Formal prayers are taught and spontaneous prayer is encouraged. Pre-Kindergarten is full-day beginning at 8:00 AM with dismissal at 2:25 PM. This is a five-day a week program. To attend, children must be 4 years of age by October 1st of that school year.

We also began accepting applications for our Kindergarten Program. Our Kindergarten is a full-day program and will consist of, but not be limited to, the following activities: Religion, Language Arts, Spanish, Math, Handwriting, Science and Social Studies, P.E., Art, Music, and Computer. Classes begin at 8:00 AM and are dismissed at 2:45 PM. To attend Kindergarten children must be 5 years of age by October 1st of that school year.





Applications for all other grades are taken throughout the month of February with testing in March and notification of acceptance in April.

Dear Parishioners,

At this time each year, we conduct the Catholic Stewardship Appeal (CSA). This important effort has proven invaluable in helping to support archdiocesan programs while at the same time assisting our parish community in meeting some of its needs. The Catholic Stewardship Appeal funds archdiocesan programs and services that meet real needs throughout the Southern Nevada area. Your stewardship in sharing some of your finances with the larger archdiocesan church is very much appreciated.

A critical component of the CSA is the Rebate Program in which all funds raised over the parish goal are returned to the parish for our own needs. The goal assessed for our parish by the Archdiocese for 2024 is \$140,115 which is 1.10% less than our 2023 goal.

As we did last year, we will use the rebate money to fund the fence construction around our parish. For a long time, we have been concerned about the security of our parish. Our school has a security officer during the school year and our church has a security officer on weekends and Holy Days. Both our school and parish have security cameras around our properties. The fence around our property will provide additional security for our parish and school community.

We have been working with the county for the approval of the fence project and we should receive final approval in late winter or early spring. After we have this approval, we will be able to determine the exact cost of the work. When we have this cost, I will report it to the parish. As we have done in the past, we will pay for the fence through parish savings, the line of credit from the Foundation and rebates from the CSA. I am very grateful to the School Foundation for their continued support.

Please be as generous as your situation allows. Fill out a pledge card, found in the church foyer, and return your gift to the parish by mail or the collection boxes at church. You can pledge your gift now and pay it off throughout the year. No gift is too small and all gifts help.

Thank you for your past support of the CSA, your consideration of this appeal and for continuing to be an important part of our faith community.


GriefShare, a 13-part weekly seminar and support group designed to help you rebuild your life.



Meet St. Viator Parish School Foundation Dinner Honorees Jon and Eillane Lim



Jon and Eillane were both raised with a very strong Catholic upbringing.

Jon was born in the Philippines and moved to Queens, New York in 1995 when he was 16 years old.

He received a full scholarship to Clarkson University in upstate New York where he earned a Bachelor of Science Degree with a double major in Finance and Management Information Systems.

During Jon's senior year in college, he was offered a position with a tech startup company in Las Vegas. That started his journey and move to Las Vegas. Not long after working as an IT programmer Jon realized he wanted to do something else. He saw an opportunity in the cellphone industry and opened his first cellphone store. This began Jon's path as a serial entrepreneur. Now, he mainly handles their family restaurant business.

Eillane attended Eugene McAteer high school in San Francisco. She pursued a Medical Assistant degree at City College of San Francisco. She then worked at different clinics throughout her Medical Assistant career while helping out in the family restaurant business. Maybe we can even learn to enjoy more how good it is to be in such a happy place.



While parishes rely on the support of parishioners through the weekly offertory collection, the ministry of the Archdiocese relies on those who participate in the Catholic Stewardship Appeal (CSA) to make possible the many services the church provides.

Each parish, based on its size and income, has a share of the total CSA budget. All money received in excess of the portion each parish is assessed is rebated to that parish.

But even as important as the rebates are, the main purpose of the CSA Campaign is to fund the ministry of the Catholic Church in southern Nevada.
