



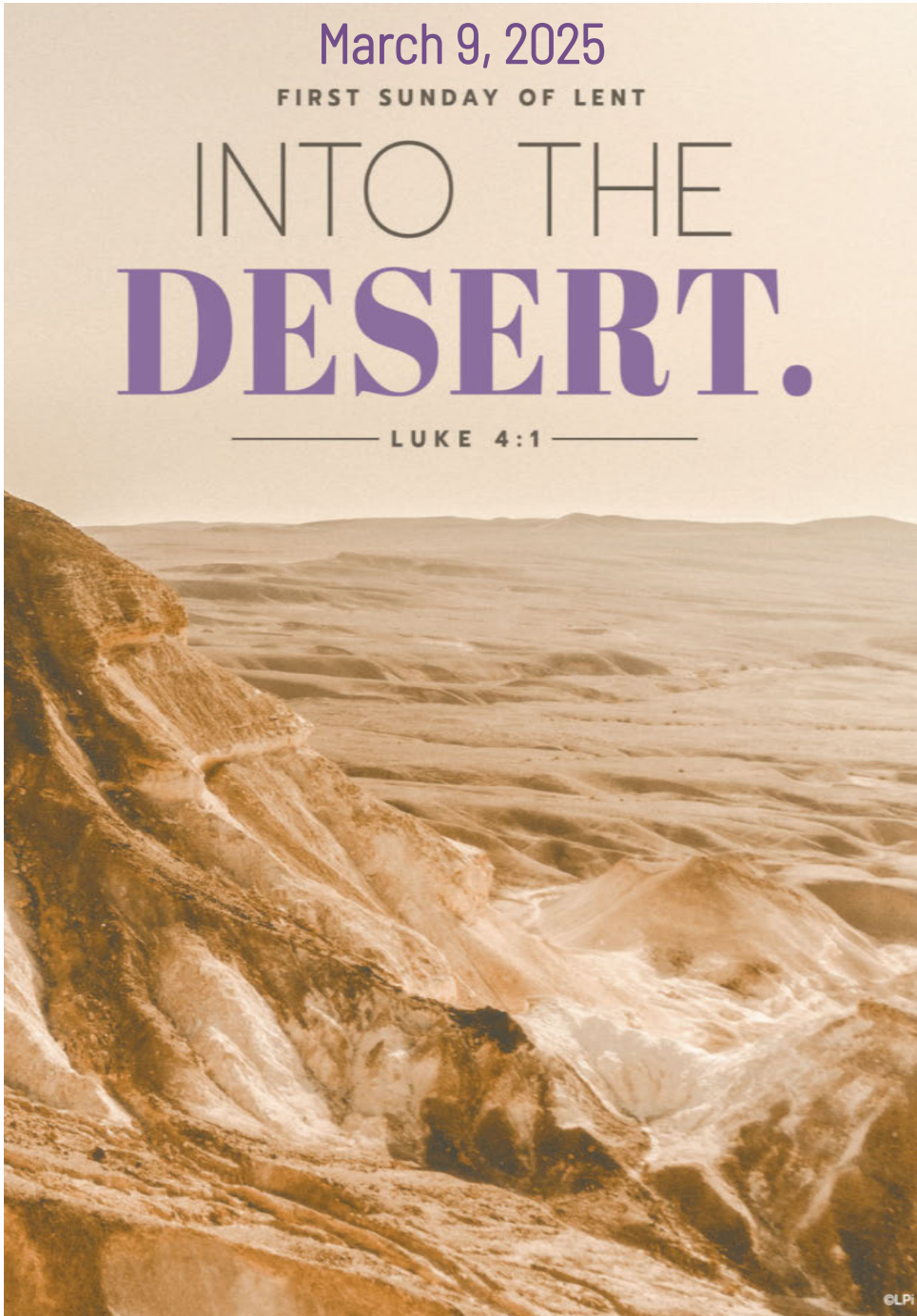

Faces of Hunger Lenten Campaign

As the Lenten season begins, we are called to practice prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. This is why we are taking part in the Faces of Hunger campaign, wherein each week of Lent, we will learn about the work being done at Catholic Charities of Southern Nevada and share the story of someone who's life was transformed by their services.

Catholic Charities has been serving vulnerable people in our community since 1941. They help an average of 4,500 people each day through programs like the Hands of Hope Community Food Pantry, Meals on Wheels, Migration and Refugee Services, the free, daily Community Meal, Homeless and Housing Services and their affiliate organization, Loving Hearts Adoption Services.

Throughout Lent, we will be taking up a special second collection to support these essential community programs.

To start this week, we will learn about the **Hands of Hope Community Food Pantry**. this food pantry each month to receive free

Approximately 4,800 families and individuals visit supplemental groceries.

As a single father to four-year-old Nohemy, Jonathan has utilized the pantry to help make ends meet. He says, "The food pantry really helps, especially around the holidays. I want to make them special for my daughter and coming here really helps."

Your contributions help sustain the pantry throughout the times of the year when food drives and donations are low, ensuring families like Jonathan and Nohemy can receive a consistent level of food each month. 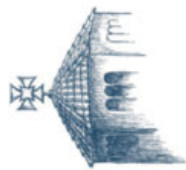
St. Viator Employment Opportunity - Director of Music for our Parish and School

GENERAL SUMMARY: The Director for Music is an integral member of the School and Parish staff and reports to our pastor and principal. This person is responsible for the effective planning, coordination, and execution of music within the Liturgical celebrations and life of the Parish community. He/she is gifted with a vision of how a local Church can develop its potential. "Among the many signs and symbols used by the Church to celebrate its faith, music is of preeminent importance ... Music should assist the assembled believers to express and share the gift of faith that is within them, and strengthen their interior commitment of faith" (Music in Catholic Worship, #23). Major responsibilities include: providing leadership in all areas related to Liturgical music; ensuring appropriate music that touches hearts and minds at Parish celebrations; recruitment, training, scheduling of music ministers; development and coordination of choirs, ensembles, etc.

- Bachelor's Degree or higher in Music, certification in Liturgical Ministry, or similar degree
- Membership in National Association of Pastoral Musicians
- Minimum 5 years of experience in Roman Catholic Liturgical music
- Minimum 3 years choral directing experience
- Successfully pass background checks, safe environment training, CMG Connect as well as other training required by the Parish/Archdiocese
- A practicing Catholic in good standing with an active faith life
- Knowledgeable of and comfortable with Church music literature in all forms and styles for the congregation, choirs (adult, teen, and children), vocalists, and instrumentalists
- Participate in staff meetings, retreats, and other trainings as needed or requested
- Mandated reporter of suspected violence or abuse
- A strong knowledge of Catholic Church teaching and a familiarity with its structures, functions and institutions ... in particular a strong understanding of Liturgy, church music, Liturgical and sacramental documents, a familiarity with Sacred/contemporary Catholic music and Liturgical principles
- Be able to make decisions and assume responsibility for delegated tasks
- Willing to work evenings, weekends, and holidays as needed or requested to accommodate needs of programs
- Maintain a professional manner in dress, attitude, and interaction with staff, parishioners, volunteers, and public
- Experience as an effective leader and administrator skilled in communication, pastoral planning, budgeting, and volunteer management
- Vacation/time off requests are not to exceed 3 weekends away per fiscal year; vacation is to be avoided on Christmas Eve/Christmas, Holy Week, Lent and Easter, the octaves of Christmas and Easter, the Solemnities of Pentecost and Christ the King, and during the annual Parish Mission unless approved by the pastor.

- Detail-oriented with ability to prioritize tasks in a timely and professional manner

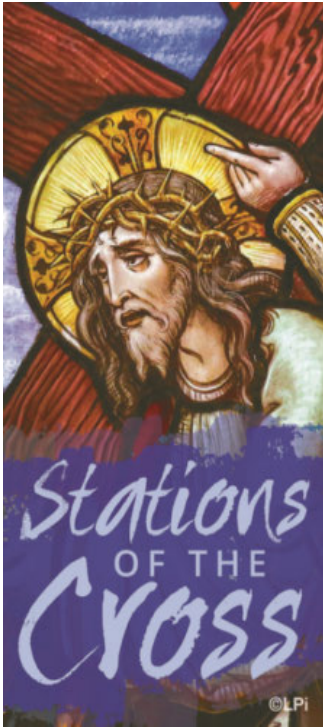

What is Lent?

Directions for Lenten Prayer Cross

FAITH & WORSHIP

One of the most fascinating moments in American history is when George Washington could have become the king of the newly liberated United States and didn't. At the height of his power and fame, on Dec. 23, 1783, he resigned his commission as Commander-in-Chief, and went home. The astonished King of England remarked that in doing so, Washington was "the greatest man in the world." Greatness is often defined by what we could do but don't. Greatness is measured by the temptations we overcome.

Jesus' greatness is revealed in his victory over temptations, too. The three offered him by the devil contain, we might say, all potential possible temptations: food, power and fame. They correspond to the triple human needs of body, soul and spirit. In overcoming these three, he says "no" in essence to every and even the greatest temptation. We see that every desire of his humanity — body, soul and spirit — is perfectly united to God, to love. This is a power available to each member of his body. It is the path to true greatness. How can we, who so easily fall into even small temptations, find the power to overcome large ones? By entering into the great dynamics of Jesus' temptations.

Lenten challenge: This first week of Lent, list some concrete ways you can overcome temptations that correspond with your desires. For example, you may give up snacks between meals, choose not to participate in an activity of which you are an expert, and decide to reduce social media posting by 50%. It may not seem like much, but by saying "no" to the tyranny of food, power, and fame (in this example), you'll discover true greatness. difficulty.

Mini Reflection: The devil knows that Jesus is human, so he uses all the best tricks he has for getting humans to break. The devil will try these things with us, too — this Lent, and throughout our lives. But how can we resist? We're only human. What do we have that the devil doesn't have?

What the Devil Doesn't Have

The devil knows all the rules. The devil knows all the Bible verses. He probably knows them better than you do (certainly better than I do).

He knows them so well that here, in today's Gospel, he thinks he can outsmart the Son of God. He thinks he can out-argue him.

See, the thing you need to know about the devil is that he could have a master's degree in theology. Maybe even a doctorate. But have you ever met a master's student, or even a doctoral one, who doesn't have a particular passion for what they're studying? I sure have.

The devil didn't rebel against God because he didn't understand God's will. He rebelled because he understood God's will perfectly — and he didn't like it.

The devil knows that Jesus is human, and so in today's Gospel he employs all the very best tricks he has for getting humans to break. Physical hunger. Insecurity and a desire for power. The yearning to appear learned and wise.

The devil will try these things with us, too — this Lent, and throughout our lives.

It doesn't work with Jesus, because, of course, Jesus is not just human. He can feel temptation, but he will not submit to it. But how are we supposed to do the same? We're not divine. We're just human.

Well, here's the thing. We may be only human, but as Christians, we have a secret weapon. (No, it's not a master's degree in theology. Some of you may have that, but it probably doesn't make you holier.)

We have a love of what the devil has renounced — those things belonging solely to God. Truth. Joy. Humility. Sanctifying sacrifice.

Let the love of those things carry you through this Lent, and beyond.
