



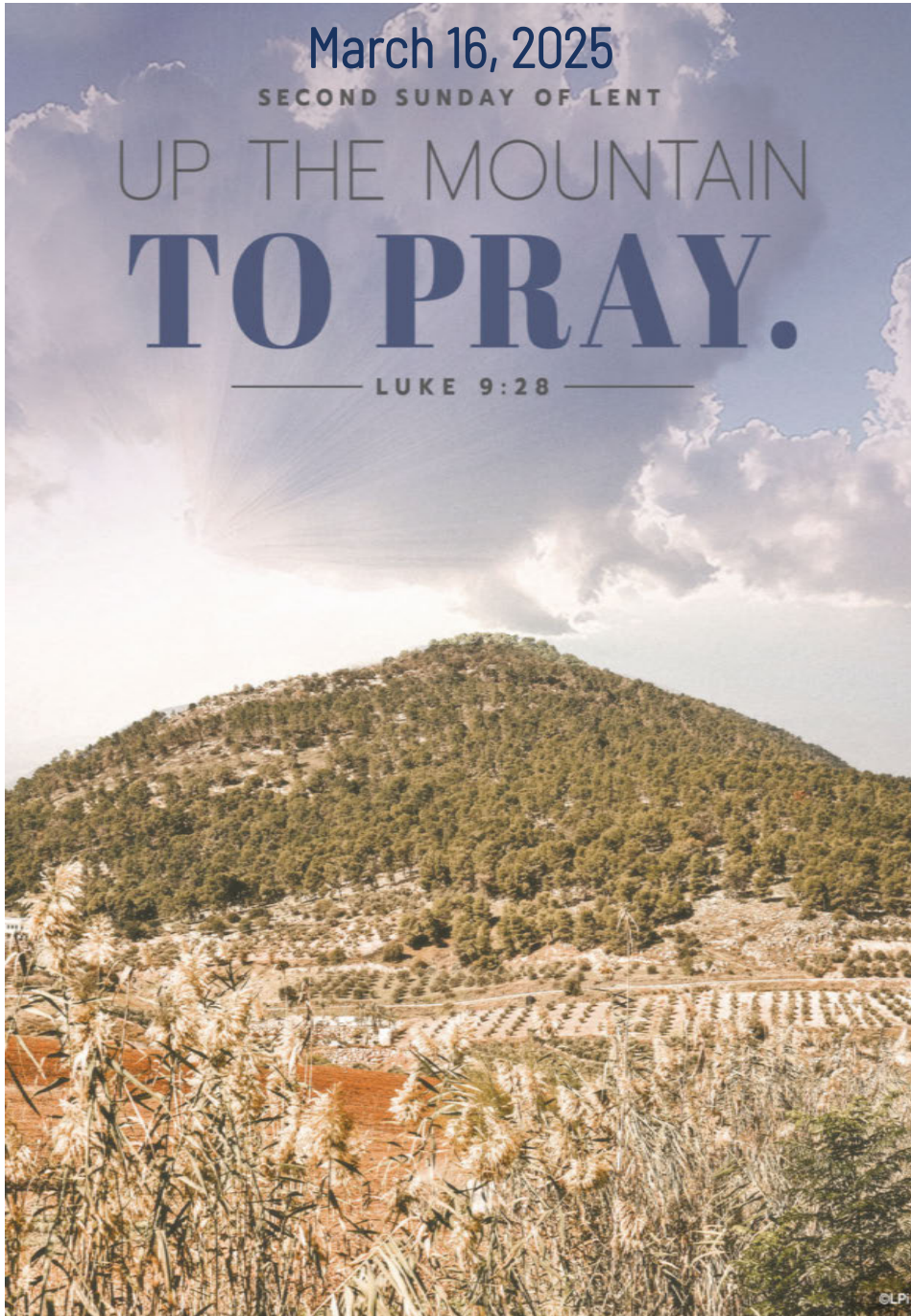

During the Lenten season, we are called to practice prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. This is why we are taking part in the Faces of Hunger campaign, wherein each week of Lent, we will learn about the work being done at Catholic Charities of Southern Nevada and share the story of someone who's life was transformed by their services.

Catholic Charities has been serving vulnerable people in our community since 1941. They help an average of 4,500 people each day through programs like the Hands of Hope Community Food Pantry, Meals on Wheels, Migration and Refugee Services, the free, daily Community Meal, Homeless and Housing Services and their affiliate organization, Loving Hearts Adoption Services.

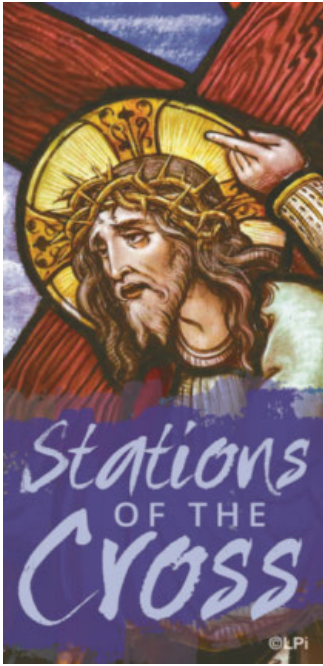
This week, we will learn about the **Meals on Wheels** program. Since 1975, this program has delivered nutritionally balanced meals to homebound seniors at no cost.

In additions to the meals, caring and compassionate delivery drivers become familiar with and check-up on each of the seniors on their route. They even bring donated pet food for those struggling to afford it.

Dave is a Meals on Wheels client who has been receiving this service since 2023 after being diagnosed with a pulmonary condition that left him physically weak and unable to prepare meals or leave the home for groceries. Living alone with this condition, Dave's doctor realized he was becoming malnourished and needed help. Thankfully, with Meals on Wheels he now receives 7 meals once a week, including nutritional supplements to get him the additional calories he needs. He says, "If I didn't receive this service it would be really hard to survive this condition. I am eternally grateful."

Catholic Charities currently serves approximately 2,400 homebound seniors in our community. The operating cost for Catholic Charities to prepare, produce and deliver these free meals averages \$9.00 per meal. They deliver over 830,000 meals a year. By contributing to the Faces of Hunger campaign, we can help sustain this program and provide a safety net for the seniors in our community. Thank you for your support.

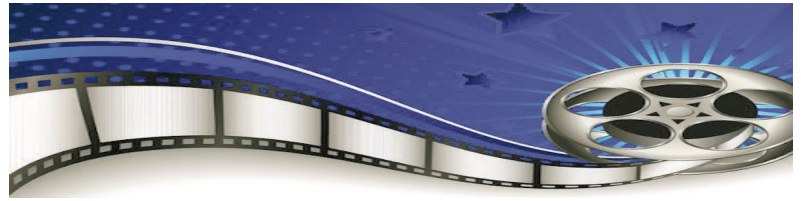

Your Lenten prayer will remain in the sanctuary of the church and the entire parish will pray for God's grace to help you change this area of your life during Lent.



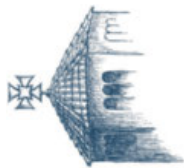
St. Viator Employment Opportunity - Director of Music for our Parish and School

Our parish Music Director, Cheri, will be retiring this summer and the search for a qualified individual to fill this full time position is now underway. GENERAL SUMMARY: The Director for Music is an integral member of the School and Parish staff and reports to our pastor and principal. This person is responsible for the effective planning, coordination, and execution of music within the Liturgical celebrations and life of the Parish community. He/she is gifted with a vision of how a local Church can develop its potential. "Among the many signs and symbols used by the Church to celebrate its faith, music is of preeminent importance ... Music should assist the assembled believers to express and share the gift of faith that is within them, and strengthen their interior commitment of faith" (Music in Catholic Worship, #23). Major responsibilities include: providing leadership in all areas related to Liturgical music; ensuring appropriate music that touches hearts and minds at Parish celebrations; recruitment, training, scheduling of music ministers; development and coordination of choirs, ensembles, etc.

- Bachelor's Degree or higher in Music, certification in Liturgical Ministry, or similar degree
- Membership in National Association of Pastoral Musicians
- Minimum 5 years of experience in Roman Catholic Liturgical music
- Minimum 3 years choral directing experience
- Successfully pass background checks, safe environment training, CMG Connect as well as other training required by the Parish/Archdiocese
- A practicing Catholic in good standing with an active faith life
- Knowledgeable of and comfortable with Church music literature in all forms and styles for the congregation, choirs (adult, teen, and children), vocalists, and instrumentalists
- Participate in staff meetings, retreats, and other trainings as needed or requested
- Mandated reporter of suspected violence or abuse
- A strong knowledge of Catholic Church teaching and a familiarity with its structures, functions and institutions ... in particular a strong understanding of Liturgy, church music, Liturgical and sacramental documents, a familiarity with Sacred/contemporary Catholic music and Liturgical principles
- Be able to make decisions and assume responsibility for delegated tasks
- Willing to work evenings, weekends, and holidays as needed or requested to accommodate needs of programs
- Maintain a professional manner in dress, attitude, and interaction with staff, parishioners, volunteers, and public
- Experience as an effective leader and administrator skilled in communication, pastoral planning, budgeting, and volunteer management
- Vacation/time off requests are not to exceed 3 weekends away per fiscal year; vacation is to be avoided on Christmas Eve/Christmas, Holy Week, Lent and Easter, the octaves of Christmas and Easter, the Solemnities of Pentecost and Christ the King, and during the annual Parish Mission unless approved by the pastor.

FAITH & WORSHIP

St. Thomas Aquinas said that friends share three things: time, possessions and secrets. For example, how do I know if you're my friend? Well, let's say we've been to Mexico together, you've tried my shaky attempts at pasta carbonara, and you know what ridiculous costume I wore in a music video I filmed in my early twenties. We, dear reader, are definitely friends. We've shared time, possessions and secrets.

How does friendship with Jesus develop? The same way. Jesus lives and eats with his disciples. Then he takes Peter, James and John to Mount Tabor and there reveals to them his deepest secret: his glorious, divine Sonship. The majesty of God shines from within his humanity in a way that goes beyond description. God the Father confirms this "secret," saying, "**This is my chosen Son, listen to him**" (Luke 9:35). It's all so precious that "**they fell silent and did not at that time tell anyone.**" Do we take time to be alone with Christ, to allow him to mystically share this "secret" with us as his dear friends?

Lenten challenge: This week, identify one time when you experienced an awareness of some specific aspect of Jesus — perhaps on a retreat, at Mass, in prayer or in an act of service. Spend ten minutes consciously re-living that experience in your heart. If you can't recall one, set aside at least two hours this Lent as a mini retreat, either alone in nature or in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament. Focus on him and ask him to share the secrets of his heart with you. He will. Then, as his friend, share the secrets in your heart.

Mini Reflection: It's always helpful to get the opinion of someone we trust when we're facing a situation that confuses or alarms us. But we all have a divine confidante that can help us sort through anything we're dealing with. Are we taking advantage of that?

The Divine Confidante

My husband pretty much knows that if he tells me something — anything — he's also telling my sister.

Most of us have that person that we run to when we have important information. I'm not even talking about gossip; I'm talking about stuff we just have to discuss. We joke that I don't really know how I feel about something until I've run it by my sister first.

There's not really anything wrong with that. When we're trying to figure out how to think about something that has happened or how to react to a certain situation, it's always helpful to get the opinion of someone we trust.

But what if we ran as quickly to discuss the situation with God as we did to discuss it with our "person?" Wouldn't that be ideal?

After witnessing the transfiguration — an event that had to have been as confusing as it was astounding — we hear that the disciples "fell silent and did not at that time tell anyone what they had seen."

When something profound, frightening, or confusing happens, our first confidante should be God. I'm reminded of Luke 2:19: "Mary kept all these things, pondering them in her heart." There is something to be said for taking a moment to keep that information sacred between ourselves and the One who can really help us confront it.

Sure, maybe we don't understand what just happened. Maybe we're scared by it. We don't really know how we feel about it. And that's totally okay. The divine confidante knows how to help us pray through that confusion, that fear.

If you're someone's "person" and they come to you wanting to talk, that's great. Talk it out. But remind them — and remind yourself — to pray about it as much as you talk about it.

Let the love of those things carry you through this Lent, and beyond.
